

A few smart-device application categories for consideration

- **Translation Apps** (there are a host of choices)
 - *Google Translate* (developer: Google, Inc.)
 - Text translation (103 languages by typing)
 - Offline (59 languages)
 - Instant camera translations (38 languages)
 - Translates bilingual conversations (32 languages)
 - I use this either for conversion of text I write, or translation of text someone else has written me in a foreign language
 - *Say Hi Translate* (developer: Say Hi)
 - Translates real-time bilingual conversations for many languages
 - I find this app great for back-and-forth bilingual conversations, or for practicing or testing one's own bilingual abilities
 - *TextGrabber 6 – Real-Time OCR* (developer: ABBYY)
 - Photographic text capture using OCR technology
 - Per the developer ABBYY, "Digitize, Translate and Action any printed information!"
- **Bilingual Dictionary Apps** (there are a numerous choices)
 - The official language of Cambodia (Khmer) is spoken by about 16 million people as opposed to English which is spoken by about 360 million (2010). Since my students are from Cambodia, I use multiple bilingual Khmer/English and English/Khmer dictionary apps because those available for Khmer are not as comprehensive as those created for more prevalently utilized languages
- **English Grammar Apps** (there are a host of options)
 - *English Verbs Conjugator Pro* (developer: Ian Tipton)
 - 2,000 verbs; 20 tenses
 - I find occasional uses for this app in clarifying conjugation nuances

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
